Principal's Comments

Remote Learning and Onsite Learning

We have had very positive comments from our SEIL Justin Butler and the DSSI (Regional team who work at Karoo every Wednesday) about our Learning from Home program. DSSI have asked permission to share our work with other schools. It has been encouraging to know that we are providing high quality teaching program during lockdown. Student engagement and attendance online has been high. Staff have been contacting families if a child is not attending and records are being kept. Onsite we have more students attending this week, therefore an additional group has been added. We are running with 3 classrooms; this supports the students to join the class meets each day. Our specialist teachers have been rostered on a daily basis to supervise students. They have been capably assisted by our Education Support staff, many have worked longer hours to provide support. They are also able to continue taking their intervention groups (LEAP Program) during the week too.

We have noticed that the students are more attentive during meets and are demonstrating competent computer skills.

Staff appreciate the feedback and interaction with parents, we acknowledge the support from parents during class meets and with their learning tasks. This week we included Wellbeing Wednesday to the timetable for all classes.

Student Reports

Staff have completed writing student reports, and we are now in the editing and proof reading stage. Student reports will be ready to upload to Compass on Thursday 24th June.

Parent Teacher Interviews

Staff will be available for Parent Teacher Interviews on Tuesday 13th July until 7.30pm and also Wednesday 14th July until 5.30pm. More details will be available on Compass soon.

Kinder to Karoo

This evening we will be holding a Parent Information Evening (WebEx). This year we will have a focus on informing parents about Karoo from the perspective of 7 years of schooling. Our Leadership team (Simone Vitas and Emma Finnerty—Learning Specialists and Robyn Mowat—Acting Leading Teacher) will be presenting on the night along with Josh Maroney and Karen Sexton. It is important that prospective parents understand the commitment we have to delivery high quality programs for all students. Equally important we would like to share our focus on building teacher capacity through professional learning, the role of our leaders in modelling best practice and how they support staff. 




